Examples of Peer Support

Adults can enlist peers to help children reach goals and fully participate in the classroom, home or community. Families and practitioners can encourage peers to invite the child to join an activity, help the child complete a task, show the child a new skill, and respond to the child appropriately. View examples of these types of embedded interventions below.
